



# KNOW YOUR Parking

**Get street smart!**

## Common Parking Offences:

The following list represents the most commonly committed parking offences.

No person shall park a vehicle in any of the following places:

- Between a sidewalk and the adjacent roadway, or in a manner that puts any part of the vehicle upon or over a sidewalk;
- On any roadway boulevard areas;
- On a roadway or shoulder in front of a public or private driveway;
- Within 2 metres of a fire hydrant;
- On any roadway or shoulder of the road between **3:00 a.m. and 5:00 a.m.**;
- In a taxi zone (if not a taxi);
- In a bus stop area (if not a bus of the London Transit Commission);
- In a loading zone, no parking zone or fire route unless the vehicle is actively being loaded or unloaded;
- In a no stopping zone vehicles may not stop, with or without an occupant, even momentarily;
- In any park/recreation area between 10:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m.;
- On any front yard or exterior side yard.

## Did you know?

- The front of the vehicle must face in the direction of the traffic flow and be parked at the side of the roadway not more than 0.3 metres from the curb;
- In angled metered parking spots, vehicles must front to the meter.

## Get street smart!

### Handicapped Parking:

Approved use of disabled person parking permits are in the following areas only:

- Designated parking spaces intended for the sole use of a vehicle of a disabled person identified by an official sign;
- At any on-street meter, without depositing coinage, for up to the time limit of the meter as posted;
- Municipal Off-Street Parking Lots that use a Pay and Display Master Meter, allows a daily extension for a maximum of two hours free parking in these designated spaces;
- All other parking zones must be adhered to as posted.

### Park and Ride Pass:

The City of London and London Transit have introduced a monthly Park & Ride Pass. Effective June 2008 Londoners will be able to park their vehicle at one of two municipal parking lots (Lot 1 and Lot 2) located north of Dundas Street with access from English Street, Elizabeth Street, Adelaide Street and Queens Avenue and take the London Transit bus downtown.

The **\$50 monthly Park and Ride Pass** allows for parking at a designated location and the cost of traveling on board London Transit buses on Dundas Street between English and Ridout streets on routes 2 Dundas, 7 Wavell and 20 Cheryhill anytime Monday - Sunday.

Participants will be issued a special parking and bus pass and will be able to claim the federal tax credit for the bus pass portion of the expense. They will have to retain their bus pass.
